The Moral Machine is a platform for gathering a human perspective on moral decisions made by machine intelligence, such as self-driving cars. Moral dilemmas are created, where a driverless car must choose the lesser of two evils, such as killing two passengers or five pedestrians. As an outside observer, you must judge which outcome you think is more acceptable. You can then see how your responses compare with those of other people. If you are feeling creative, you can also design your own scenarios, for others to view, share, and discuss.
