Learning

ENGLISH:

Creative Writing, Lord of the Flies, and Romeo and Juliet

Students will conclude their study of *Lord of the Flies* with some creative writing work inspired by Golding's style. They will then study Shakespeare's play *Romeo and Juliet*.

MATHS:

Individual class focus for this term: **Miss Morgan & Mrs Price's class:** Congruence & Similarity, Sequences & Graphs **Mr Poolman's & Mrs Twyford's classes**: Angles & Algebra **Mr Smytheman's class:** Sequences & Graphs, Congruency & Similarity, Probability **Mr Whitley's class:** Pythagoras & Trigonometry, Angles

SEPARATE SCIENCES:

In **Biology**, students will study photosynthesis, the importance of this reaction, and the uses of glucose. As part of this they will complete a key required practical. They will then consider both aerobic and anaerobic respiration and its effects on the body.

In **Chemistry**, students will study energy changes in chemical reactions and calculate the energy released or taken in during exothermic and endothermic reactions. They will also study electrolysis and how substance can be extracted and complete equations and calculations to describe this process.

In **Physics**, students will be studying atomic structure and look at the properties, uses and dangers associated with nuclear radiation. They will also look at the nuclear reactions of fission and fusion.

COMBINED SCIENCE:

In Combined Science, students will study **Biology** topics on photosynthesis, the uses of glucose and the respiration reactions. They will look at a **Physics** topic studying atomic structure and look at the properties, uses and dangers associated with nuclear radiation.

CORE PE:

Students will be working in competitive and semi competitive situations. Some students use the time to develop their confidence in their GCSE PE practical areas and others participate in a more recreational but purposeful way. Our 'healthy active lifestyles' motto remains at the core of everything we do.

PSHE:

We will explore our *Dreams & Goals*, focusing on the balance between physical and emotional needs for success. This sequence will explore relationships, health goals, work/life balance, and the importance of community in achieving these aspirations. Emphasis is placed on resilience, mental health and nurturing important relationships.

WORK EXPERIENCE

The deadline for all year 10 students to confirm their placement for work experience is Friday 31st January 2025. In order to develop independence and professional skills, students have the responsibility of contacting employers and confirming their placement for the week beginning Monday 7th July 2025. MARCH MOCK EXAMS

Year 10 will have their first full set of mock exams in March at the end of term 4. Students will be informed in class about how to prepare for these and will spend some time in lessons preparing. We will be updating the specific guidance for the March mock exams in January. This will be sent to you directly.

It is essential that students are fully equipped for these exams, ensuring they have pens, pencils, an eraser, ruler calculator, compass, and protractor. Compasses and protractors can be hired for student services for 50p each if needed. Students will not be able to borrow equipment from school during the mock exams. If there are any issues with organising this equipment, please contact your child's tutor who will be able to provide support.

100 BOOKS - READING CHALLENGE

Students are being encouraged to engage with our **100 Books to Read Whilst You're at Fitzharrys** booklet. Each time a student has read ten books from our list, they will be entered into a prize draw to win book vouchers from local bookstore, Mostly Books. Reading Award badges will be given out when students reach the milestones of 25 books, 50 books and 75 books. Any student who reads all 100 books before leaving Fitzharrys will receive a Platinum Award.

BEDROCK BRILLIANCE

HOMEWORK

Homework is an important part of what we do at Fitzharrys School. Research suggests that meaningful homework supports the acceleration of progress in students of secondary school age. We aim, through homework, to promote a culture of scholarship, setting purposeful homework for revision, preparation, and consolidation. Specific homework details can be found on **Epraise**, where you can also see whether your child has completed and handed their work in.

To support students with this important aspect of their scholarship, we offer a wraparound service where students can complete work on school premises:

- Our computer room SI is open on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning from 8am;
- Our Library is usually open every breaktime and lunchtime;
- We offer Homework Club in West Block until 4pm each day;
- Our computer room SI is also open on a Tuesday until 4pm and a Thursday until 4:30pm.
