2024-25: Term 3 Overview

Our Overview newsletters contain the key information you'll need each term.

Briefing on curriculum content, extra-curricular opportunities, current school messages and more, parents and carers can use this outline to support students and help them succeed at school.

Learning

ENGLISH: Dystopian Fiction – Students will study a dystopian novel and, along the way, be introduced to the conventions of dystopian fiction. They will produce an analytical essay that connects the language, structure and form of an extract with that of the novel more widely.

MATHS: At the start of Term 3, we finish off our *Length, Area & Volume* topic before moving on to *Sequences, Functions & Graphs*. This unit enables pupils to connect the algebraic representations they'll have met in year 7 with graphical representations, as well as exploring conversion graphs and distance-time graphs.

SCIENCE: Students undertake a Chemistry topic on metal reactions and energy changes. They will also study a Physics topic on electricity and magnetism.

ART: Students will further develop their painting skills, taking inspiration from the work of Stephen Gardner and others. We will focus on using watercolour and biro to create mixed media studies of different buildings. Students will have the opportunity to decorate their clay houses using oxides and glazes.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will learn about: network protocols and the components that make up a computer network; how messages are sent across the internet; and explore Internet Services and the World Wide Web.

DRAMA: Students are studying Michal Frayn's play: *Audience*. Their assessment performance inspired by this script will be rehearsing a melodrama entitled *The Damsel in Distress* where students will devise their own ending.

FRENCH: Animals - Exploring the world of animals. Students will revisit the use of adjectives. They will study "venir de" in the present, possessive adjectives and reflexive verbs. Students will discover a French fiction character.

GEOGRAPHY: *Population and Migration* – Students will explore how the global population has changed over time, and how population is distributed around the world, through exploring patterns of migration and urbanisation.

HISTORY: Students will study the Industrial Revolution and the impact it had on both Britain and Oxfordshire, as well as understanding the wider significance of this time period in Britain.

MUSIC: Western African Drumming - Students will be learning about traditional West African drumming; performing, composing, and how it is learnt by ear.

PHILOSOPHY & ETHICS: *Religious rites of passage* – do they matter? An investigation into different religious ceremonies that take place during a person's life, with an evaluation of their importance in today's world.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: This term, students will have an opportunity to develop their skills and explore more advanced principals in Invasion and Net Games, with Gymnastics activities also being learned.

PSHE: Dreams & Goals - We will explore the big question of "Can the choices I make now influence my future?" This will include understanding long-term goals, the role of money in society, online safety, income variations across the world, and the impact of financial decisions on mental health and community dynamics.

SPANISH: Volcanoes and earthquakes - Understanding authentic texts and videos about volcanoes and earthquakes in Spanish speaking regions. Students will study colours, modal verbs and the use of the infinitive. They will make cross curricular links with Geography.

ACHIEVEMENT ASSEMBLY

Term 2 ended with an Achievement assembly which celebrated all the fantastic progress made by students since September. Over 24,000 House points have been awarded to Year 8 students already this year, with 39 students achieving their bronze House point award. Well done to form 8T who had the highest House point total with 6283 points Terms 1– 2! Many Year 8s received 3 or more subject award nominations for showing Aspiration, Opportunity and Integrity in their lessons, and 25 students received recognition for 100% attendance. Students that were absent for only one day due to a medical or other urgent appointment also received a 100% achievement award. The Achievement assembly was an inspiring review of all the hard work and dedication shown by our students. Congratulations to all!

IMPACT PROGRESS CHECKS

At the end of this term, Year 8 students will receive impact progress checks. Feedback for each subject includes specific targets set by teachers that, if completed, will have a positive impact on your child's progress.

We would be very grateful to have parents' support in encouraging students to complete these targets by:

- 1. Reviewing the targets with your child and discussing how and when they will achieve them;
- 2. Placing the report somewhere prominent and regularly checking to see if they have completed their targets.

100 BOOKS - READING CHALLENGE

Students are being encouraged to engage with our **100 Books to Read Whilst You're at Fitzharrys** booklet. Each time a student has read ten books from our list, they will be entered into a prize draw to win book vouchers from local bookstore, Mostly Books. Reading Award badges will be given out when students reach the milestones of 25 books, 50 books and 75 books. Any student who reads all 100 books before leaving Fitzharrys will receive a Platinum Award.

BEDROCK BRILLIANCE

An email from Bedrock was received last term to congratulate Fitzharrys School for being in the top ten schools internationally for tier 2 vocabulary learning and engagement. Out of approximately 900 schools, this is an amazing achievement! A huge well done to all students for working hard and completing your Bedrock activities!

HOMEWORK

Homework is an important part of what we do at Fitzharrys School. Research suggests that meaningful homework supports the acceleration of progress in students of secondary school age. We aim, through homework, to promote a culture of scholarship, setting purposeful homework for revision, preparation, and consolidation. Specific homework details can be found on **Epraise**, where you can also see whether your child has completed and handed their work in.

To support students with this important aspect of their scholarship, we offer a wraparound service where students can complete work on school premises:

- Our computer room SI is open on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning from 8am;
- Our Library is usually open every breaktime and lunchtime;
- We offer Homework Club in West Block until 4pm each day;
- Our computer room S1 is also open on a Tuesday until 4pm and a Thursday until 4:30pm.
